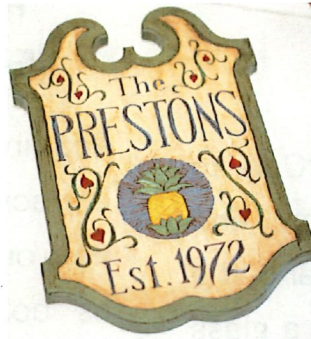

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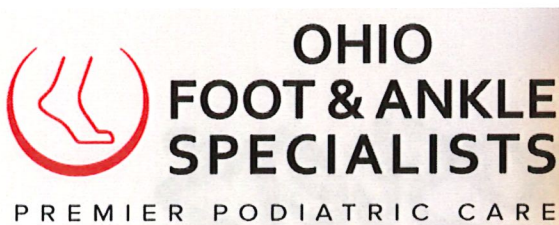

PSC would like to acknowledge the generosity of one of our members, Betsy Preston. She and her husband Jim, were married for almost 53 years. Early in their marriage they created a list of 10 life experiences they hoped to share. Years later they came across that list and were amazed to see that they had fulfilled 9 of those 10 dreams, with only a journey to Germany remaining. Sadly, Jim passed away before they were able to take their trip. Within our community, we have many members who can truly understand the weight of Betsy's experience through their own journeys of loss and can offer genuine empathy and shared understanding.

Betsy and Jim built a beautiful life together. In the early years of their marriage, Betsy worked as a nurse to help fund Jim through medical school. He then paid back a portion of his education by serving in the US Army in the emergency room, before dedicating his civilian career to helping others as a family doctor. He was also the County Coroner in Defiance, Ohio. Beyond medicine, Jim loved playing bridge, blew glass at his neon art studio, and was a talented woodworker who intricately carved a custom wooden tap handle for every unique batch of homebrew beer he made.

Betsy felt that the best way to honor Jim's memory was not by taking a fleeting trip retracing the steps they had planned together, but through a permanent gift that would serve others for years to come. She made a very generous donation to our Center to be used toward our kitchen renovation. Jim was a man who cared about his community and would be proud to see the money they saved used to bring people together. Every meal served from our new kitchen will be a tribute to a devoted husband, a loving wife, and a dream that was transformed into a blessing for us all.

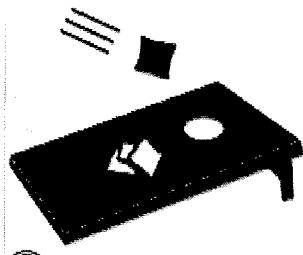

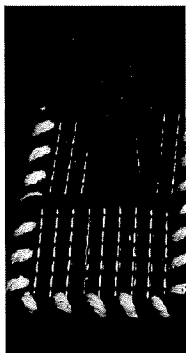

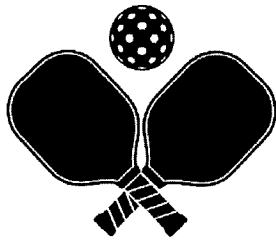

2026 PSC GOALS/PROJECTS

Below is a list of goals identified for 2026. These goals are set high, but attainable. If you identify with one or more you would like to be part of, please see Craig or Jeff for details on how you can help. These goals are in no particular order of importance or timing, other than calendar year 2026.

RAISED BED GARDENING PROGRAM – project will involve construction and installation of new raised beds on our grounds to promote gardening for our seniors.

HIGH SCHOOL MENTORING PROGRAM – project will entail working with local high schools and students to become a mentor for a local young person.

TECHNOLOGY TRAINING/CENTER – in conjunction with our Library and donations of computers. Our goal is to develop a technology training program for our seniors for software training, app and phone technology and much more.

FACE LIFT/MODERNIZING OUTSIDE OF BUILDING – project will entail painting exterior of building and replacing shutters/walkways with more of a modern natural look.

UPGRADING INTERIOR CEILING AND LIGHTS – renew our ceiling tiles and change to energy efficient LED lighting.

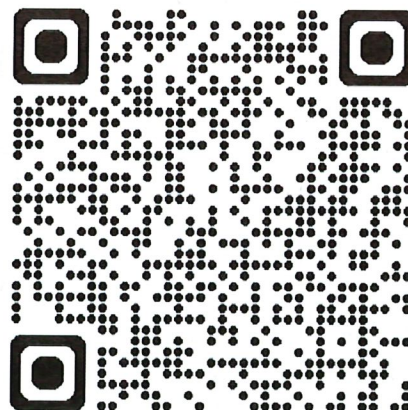
PARKING LOT PAINT/SIGNAGE/SEALANT – project involves painting parking lines and traffic flow directions for the parking lot.

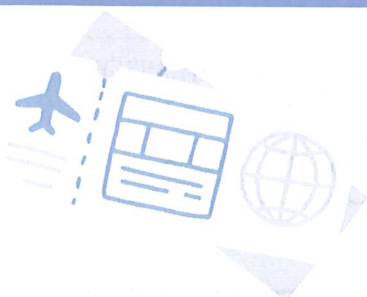

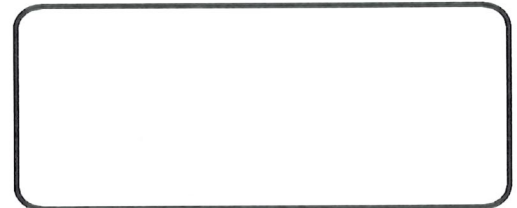
