KITCHEN REMODELING UPDATES

The Pickerington Senior Center would like to thank THE UNITED WAY of FAIRFIELD COUNTY for awarding us with a grant to remodel our kitchen in the amount of \$30,000. This, to our knowledge, is the largest single sum of money awarded via grant to our Senior Center. With the grant, the total we have raised year-to-date for the kitchen remodel is nearly \$50,000. Our overall goal is to raise \$100,000 to fund a complete kitchen remodel, designed to upgrade our commercial appliances and improve logistics to better serve our seniors and allow up to four (4) entities to work in the kitchen simultaneously without interfering with senior center activities.

Beginning in late July, we began purchasing some equipment and remodeling the kitchen. We have spent time with each of our chefs to determine their needs for our kitchen. We completed most of the logistical upgrades to the kitchen in August, including reworking the plumbing to create more space in our kitchen. Painting and removal of old products and items are in progress. Also, the new cabinets are scheduled to be installed by mid-September. Once complete, the final stage of the remodel will include installation of an island and new cooking equipment which will allow for multiple entities to work at the same time.

2026 PSC GOALS/PROJECTS

Below is a list of goals identified for 2026. These goals are ambitious, but attainable. If you identify with one or more you would like to be part of, please see Craig or Jeff for details on how you can help. These goals are in no particular order of importance or timing, other than occurring during calendar year 2026.

RAISED BED GARDENING PROGRAM – project will involve construction and installation of new raised beds. **UPDATE:** In process. We are working with Lowe's to determine exterior updates or gardening updates as a priority of their participation.

HIGH SCHOOL MENTORING PROGRAM – project will entail working with local high schools and students to become a mentor for a local young person. **UPDATE:** In place, will begin September of 2026. **IN Progress**

TECHNOLOGY TRAINING/CENTER – **Completed**

FACE LIFT/MODERNIZING OUTSIDE OF BUILDING – project will entail painting exterior of building and replacing shutters/walkways with more of a modern natural look. More to come on this project as it will likely become the main project for 2027.

UPGRADING INTERIOR CEILING AND LIGHTS – renew our ceiling tiles and change to energy efficient LED lighting. **UPDATE:** All of our lighting fixtures are LED in the main rooms of the building. We are exploring options for ceiling tiles. **Scheduled for October**

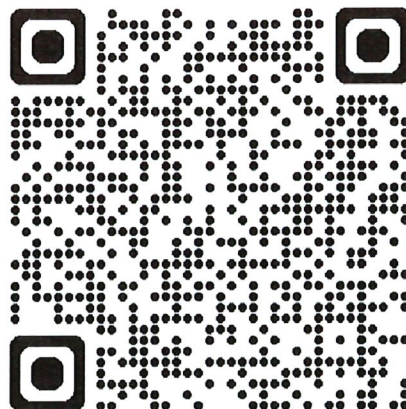

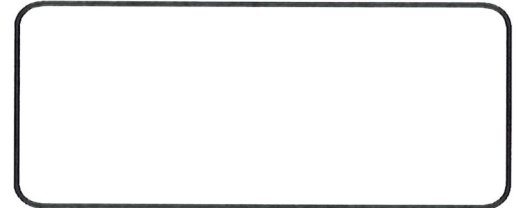
